The Risen Lord Jesus Reveals Himself to Us in the Holy Gospel

The Third Sunday of Easter has traditionally been called *"Misericordias Domini."* It derives its name from the Latin words of the Introit of the day from Psalm 33:5b, "The earth is full of the mercy *(miseriscordias)* of the Lord *(Domini).*"

The Word of the Lord endures forever. This living and abiding Word of God is the preaching of Christ Jesus, namely that God "raised him from the dead and glorified him" (1 Peter 1:21). By this Word we have been born again to eternal life and ransomed from our sinful and mortal life "with the precious blood of Christ" (1 Peter 1:18–19). This Word also calls us to repentance, to dying and rising in Holy Baptism "in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of (our) sins" (Acts 2:38). As Christ opens the Scriptures, he opens our minds to comprehend the things concerning himself and he brings us to know him (Luke 24:27).

SERMON Luke 24:13-35

NICENE CREED (Romans 10:9-10; Philippians 2:10-11)

"About the Propers," a document explaining the changeable parts of the service, and "The Congregation at Prayer," a document offering suggestions for daily devotions and Scripture readings are posted on our website.

The Paschal Candle: Paschal, meaning "having to do with the Passover," is a word associated with Easter, for it was at the conclusion of the Jewish Passover Festival (the "Pasch") that Jesus rose from the dead and proved himself to be the true Passover Lamb whose blood removes the threat of death (Exodus 12 & 1 Corinthians 6:6-8). Paschal Candles are usually very large, white, and inscribed with a cross and the Greek letters Alpha and Omega (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet), which symbolize that Christ is eternal, the beginning and end (Revelation 1:8; 22:13). The candle is lit every Easter morning to symbolize that Christ is alive and lives among his people. It is then lit for every service during the season of Easter as we continue to celebrate Christ's resurrection. The candle is also lit at Holy Baptisms and Christian funerals, reminding us of the believer's new birth and resurrection to eternal life through Christ our Lord.
