The Christian is planted by the Word and produces fruit

The Sunday is summarized in the Prayer of the Day which thanks God for the implanting of the Word and asks for the Spirit's help in producing fruits of faith.

As “the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish (Isaiah 55:10), so the Word of God accomplishes the purpose for which he speaks it, granting joy and peace through the forgiveness of sins and producing the fruits of faith and love in those who are called by his Name.

Christ Jesus, the incarnate Word, opens our ears to hear, our minds to understand, and our hearts to believe his Word, lest the evil one come and snatch it away. He thus transforms our rocky hearts into good soil, which clings to the Gospel and “produces a good crop” of fruits of righteousness (Matthew 13:23). Jesus himself is the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. Therefore, since Christ has been raised, we too shall live. In this hope of adoption and redemption, we wait with patience.

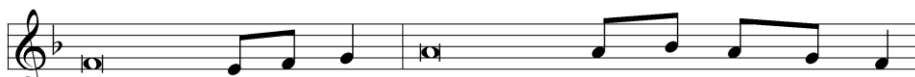
HOLY ABSOLUTION (John 20:19-23)

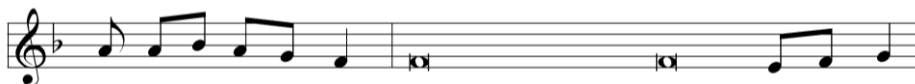

Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

NICENE CREED (Romans 10:9-10; Philippians 2:10-11)

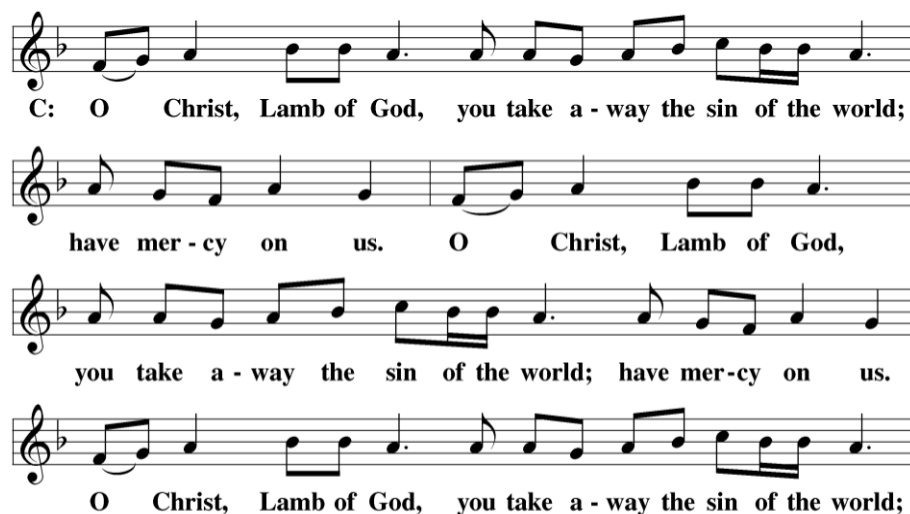


