

# ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Sunday - August 16, 2020



***Christ Jesus, the Living Bread from Heaven, Feeds the Children of God.***

By the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we are made children of God. Therefore, listen diligently, and “hear, that your soul may live. By his sacrificial death in his flesh and blood he has made an everlasting covenant for us. Since he now calls us to himself, we come to him “and eat what is good, and delight ... in the richest fare” (Isaiah 55:2-3). He has come with divine compassion to save us from sin and death and to feed us with himself.

As our Lord Jesus once took bread, “gave thanks,” broke the loaves, “and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people” (Matthew 14:18-19), he also now takes bread, blesses it by his Word to be his very body, and distributes it to his Church by the hand of his called and ordained servants. There is more than enough for His whole Church to eat and to be satisfied (Matthew 14:20).





Matthew 14:13-21

**NICENE CREED** (Romans 10:9-10; Philippians 2:10-11)




