

The Church Lives Under the Cross of Christ and Prays in the Hope of His Mercy

The chosen people of God could see nothing in Christ but a breaker of man-made traditions. Jesus' words to them could not be harsher. They were the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophesy: their outward rites and rituals belied an inward spiritual emptiness.


After leaving the land of God's chosen people, Jesus found a woman – a Canaanite woman – who received the Word of God and trusted in God's promises in a way that shamed every one of the religious teachers. By her persistent prayer that Jesus would have mercy and help her, and even in the face of his initial silence and apparent rejection, the Canaanite woman boldly confessed her faith in him.


The Canaanite woman's beautiful example encourages us to cling to the words and promises of the Gospel, even in the face of the Law that accuses and condemns us. The woman's faith and hope were not disappointed, but her prayers were answered in the mercy of Christ. Likewise with us, Jesus not only gives us the crumbs from his table, but he also feeds abundantly with the Bread of Life.





SERMON

Matthew 15:21-28


Personal Prayer after Holy Communion


