

The Church forgives as God forgives

Anytime we try to imitate God, we quickly realize our inadequacy. Yet today God tells us to model our forgiveness on his: a boundless, free, and loving forgiveness based on the sacrifice of Christ.

How could our sinful hearts ever forgive like that? Through Christ alone. God has unconditionally forgiven our sins through the substitutionary life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we realize the great gift of forgiveness that our God has given us, we are also inspired to forgive one another.

The Prayer of the Day asks that the mercy and grace of God precede us and follow after us, that we might love God with undivided hearts—hearts always ready to forgive as God does: sins are forgiven, forgotten, forever.




### GOSPEL OF THE DAY Matthew 18:21-35






