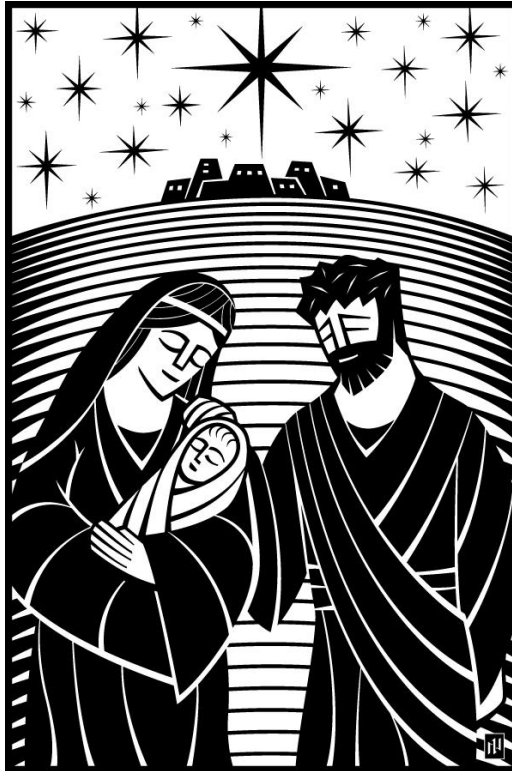

The Season of Christmas
What Child Is This?

A baby is born every twelve seconds. That's 140 million babies born each year. Yet, there is something that sets *this child* apart from all others. It is not simply his humble beginnings, with a cattle trough as his first cradle. It is not just the miraculous nature of his birth, his mother being a virgin. There is so much more. This child is the only hope we have for peace and a future. This child can wipe away every tear, drive away every fear. Here is the truth of Christmas. With this child, you lack nothing. Without him, you have nothing. Let us use this season of Christmas to answer this most important question: *What child is this?*

This Christmas Eve, an angel answers that question. "A savior has been born to you." It is a stunning statement, for two reasons. First, this child looks nothing like what we would expect in a hero-savior. This child is weak, helpless, and mired in poverty. Second, he has come to bring salvation "to you." It is a salvation we all need desperately. It was God's gift to us, given on that first Christmas when Christ our Savior was born!



EXHORTATION

M: Dear people of God, in this Christmas season it is our duty and delight to hear again the message of the angels and, in heart and mind, to go to Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us – the Christ Child lying in a manger.

Let us read and learn in Holy Scripture the story of the loving purposes of God who brought us redemption through this holy Child.

But first, let us pray for people all over the world who would delight with us to know the good news of Jesus Christ and who would join with us in singing his praises. Let us pray for the people of this city and for all those in our own congregation.

And, because this would please our Lord, let us remember in his name the poor and helpless, the cold, the hungry and the oppressed, the sick and those who are sad, the lonely and the unloved, and the elderly and the little children. We especially remember all those who do not know the Lord Jesus, those who do not love him, and those who by sin have grieved his heart of love.

Finally, let us remember before God all those who rejoice with us in heaven, who live in greater light than we, that multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, who died in faith, and who live before the throne of God and praise him each day in his temple. We confess that we are united with them as we are united with one another.

To sum up all these petitions, let us pray as Christ himself taught us.

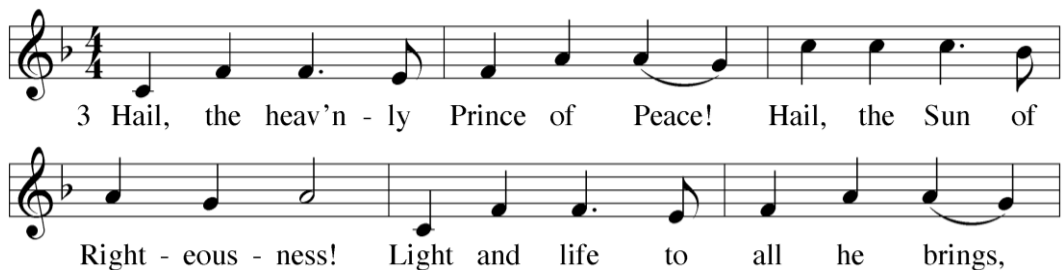



A Friendship Register (i.e. the maroon book) is located at the end of each pew. Sometime before you leave, please write in your name and the names of those with you, check any appropriate box, and provide your contact information if you want the pastor to speak with you.

CANDLE LIGHTING INSTRUCTIONS

- * *The pastor will light his candle from the Christ Candle. He will pass the light to the ushers, and they in turn will walk down the center aisle and light the candles of those sitting closet to the aisle.*

As the light comes to you, please hold your unlit candle to the flame.

Only tip the unlit candles. Never tip the lit candles.

While your candle is lit, please keep it upright so the wax dripping is minimized.

Please do not bring the lit candles onto the carpet.

Once your candle is lit, hold it to the person next to you so they can light their candle from yours.

In this way we symbolize how Jesus, the Light of the world, came and brings light to a world darkened by sin as his Gospel spreads from one person to the next.

After all the candles have been lit, the church lights will be dimmed, and the pastor will lead the congregation in the candle lighting dialogue.

CANDLE LIGHTING DIALOUGE

- * *The lights are turned down.*

Please stand at the direction of the pastor.

M: As the light of these candles illumines our faces, it reminds us of Christ, our Light, the Child in the manger at Bethlehem, a Savior suffering our death on the cross, and soon to come from his throne on high as Judge of all. He is our Light here on earth and the eternal Light who enlightens heaven, where there is no need of candle or sun. Rejoice! The Light of the World has come.

M: This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.

C: **If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth.** (1 John 1:5,6)

M: But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another,

C: **and the blood of Jesus, his Son, cleanses us from all sin.** (1 John 1:7)

CONCLUDING PRAYER

M: Let us pray.

O God, who makes us glad with the yearly remembrance of the birth of your only Son, Jesus Christ, grant that as we joyfully receive him as our Redeemer, so we may with sure confidence behold him when he shall come to be our Judge; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: **Amen.**
